Description

Provide a short description of the event and its activities.



The objective of the "Making Jewish Heritage" activity was to involve participants in the Jewish Heritage in textiles. This involves understanding the textile work of Otti Berger and Anni Albers, one who survived and shaped modern design and textiles, the other who was murdered in Auschwitz.

- 1. You will learn about their legacy and contribution to Europe values and history.
- 2. You will see the work to **reconstruct the remaining carpet of Otti Berger** which is in Chemnitz and touch our reconstruction.
- 3. You will then **participate in making a miniature textile**, which you can take home with you, having learnt and made Jewish heritage.

The activity also involved primary research in Chemnitz and the weaving of Otti Berger textiles which will be displayed in the Museum of Survivors to help revive the legacy of Jewish, Bauhaus textiles.

A video description of the exercise and historical background was also developed and the activity contributes to the overall impact evaluation of knowledge, attitudes and behaviours.
